Each artwork must be accompanied by a clearly written or typed essay.

ENTRY GUIDELINES

Entries must stay within word limitation for the grade level, otherwise the essay will be disqualified. The essay will be judged on clarity, grammar, and how well the youth developed the theme based on age of the writer.

- 1. Art Entries must be submitted on poster no large than 18X24 medium size and the essay typed or written legible on loose paper.
- 2. <u>Do not</u> write your names on the artwork as it will be judged, used and displayed publicly on an outreach and awareness campaign in various venues by the Burnett-Eaton Museum Foundation's discretion.
- 3. All artwork entries must be original and must not contain or use in any copyrighted or trademarked images or reproductions.
- 4. Limit one art-essay entry per student.
- *All entries should address the theme for peace and how the underlying causes of violence can be prevented. Some Suggested Topic for Essay with Solution: How Can Violence Be Controlled, Bullying, Fire Prevention, Vaping/Drugs Electronic Media and Youth Violence, Drug Violence, Cyber Bullying, Gang Violence, Cultural Violence, Structural Violence, Physical Violence, Metal detectors, Reflect peace in your art-essay.
 - **5.** All entries submitted will become the property of the Burnett-Eaton Museum Foundation and will not be returned to entrant.
 - **6.** This registration form must be returned with art-essay entry.
